Individuals will present a 5-to-7-minute talk suitable as a platform speech or radio broadcast. The presentation should serve to persuade others regarding a particular issue or concern. Props and visual aids are not permitted, and recordings of any type may not be used. Contestants should be prepared to answer

subject matter of their presentation. Contestants selected as finalists will then repeat their presentations in a final round. First place individuals will be asked to present their speech at the Thursday night assembly. Suggested presentation topics: Current events, youth issues, or other topics related to youth Topic resources:

• Print media (e.g. newspapers, magazines, scholarly journals)

EDUCATIONAL PRESENTATION

Age Division: Open to all ages at District - Junior, Intermediate, and Senior

- Individual or Team of 2 to 5*
- Top 3 (three) senior placing entries in each category will advance to State Roundup

Subjects in the Educational Presentations should address emerging or current issues in each of the contest areas. A 12-minute presentation should relate to the contest entered, should contain current information, and should not be better suited for another contest. It should also be appropriate for the member's age and experience. An additional nine (9) minutes will be provided for on-stage arrangements and cleanup in connection with the presentation. A penalty of two points per minute or partial minute overtime will be deducted from the final score. Appropriate credit should be given for references used. Participants will present presentation one time.

*The Horse and Open FCH Educational Presentations are open to Individuals or Teams of 2 (two) due available for these particular categories.

This program is based on science and the scientific method using the 4-H Science, Engineering, and T echnology (S.E.T.) model. The 4-H Science experience is a program that is framed in science, engineering, and technology concepts. The objective is to implement science, engineering, and technology in the forefront of all 4-H project work. The Discover Scientific Method Research Poster Contest will allow youth to apply the scientific method to the subject matter they have learned through their 4-H projects. The scientific method is a process for experimentation that is used to explore observations and answer questions. Scientists use the scientific

VETERINARY SCIENCE

PROJECT DETAILS

The veterinary science 4-H project area connects a love for animals with an interest in science. Explore the many careers in animal and veterinary science, study the health and anatomy of animals, understand animal health in relation to humans, and learn through experience how to care for an animal. Whether you'd like to become a veterinarian or just want to learn more about your pet, this project area provides the opportunity to learn all about animals.

PROJECT MEETING

Project kicks off on Monday, April 6, 2020!

Meetings begin in April and will conclude in May. 6-8 week project series each Monday at 6:00pm.

ADDITIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

Veterinary Science Certificate Program (VSCP) participants (ages 12+) learn the skills necessary to become a veterinary assistant (VA). Graduates of the program earn the veterinary assistant (VA) title and classification, and are eligible for CVA certification through the <u>Texas Veterinary Medical Association</u> by examination.

•Curriculum Requirements – 100 lessons

75 core lessons and 25 lessons in chosen career track (i.e., clinical, One Health, or laboratory).

•Apprenticeship Requirements - 500 hours

Participants complete 500 apprenticeship hours in their chosen career track: 1) Clinical, 2) One Health, or 3) Laboratory.

WILDLIFE & FISHERIES

PROJECT DETAILS

You'll learn how to manage land, natural resources, and the environment. You can learn about your environment, and the responsibility you have for natural resources, and the connections between plants, animals, soil, and water. This is a great project for someone who wants to own a ranch or manage land that produces renewable goods and services for humans. Currently focused on Plant Id but Soil and Range are also available when there is interest.

Topics could include:

Ranchland management, Water and how plants grow, Vegetation areas of Texas, Brush control and weed control, Poisonous or toxic plants, Grazing management strategies, Ranch management practices and leasing rangeland, risk

Project Details

This project covers firearm safety and teaches responsible handling and use for a variety of firearms, Including pistols, rifles, shotguns, muzzleloading, and archery. In the Shooting Sports project, youth will learn: how to load and shoot a variety of firearms, proper maintenance of firearms, parts, and accessories, proper safety procedures in handling and shooting, about shooting sports competitions and how to participate, hunting procedures, laws and ethics related to shooting, hunting, and firearms use, and about careers related to firearms and shooting sports.

FASHION & INTERIOR DESIGN

Project Details

In the 4-H Fashion and Interior Design program youth learn to design, construct and be a smart consumer when purchasing clothing and household items. Projects can be designed around parts of fashion and interior design such as: applying elements and principles of design, learn to operate a sewing machine, fabric science labs, fashion and interior design sketching, consumer buying skills, creating a storyboard for your designs, creating one of a kind items for home decorating, entrepreneurship, and upcycling items for a new purpose. There are several different contests and opportunities within the project area as well as the Ambassador program.

- Olney Sewing Group: Third Monday of every month from 4:00-5:00pm at the Olney First Baptist Church.

Project Opportunities

Duds to Dazzle: 4-Hers participate in the 4-H Clothing & Textile project to become knowledgeable in a multitude of concentrated skills. In the Texas 4-H Duds to Dazzle qualifying competition, the learning experience is taken another step beyond by "going green". In the contest, teams of 3-5 4-H members will be challenged to take a textile that is no longer usable for its original purpose, and refurbish it into a new, viable consumer product; recycling textiles so they do not end up in the waste stream. Objectives include: 1) Allow participants to exhibit knowledge and skills gained through their 4-H Clothing & Textiles project by designing, constructing, and presenting a finished product, 2) Allow participants learning opportunities, 3) Promote teamwork, 4) Help 4-H'ers gain experience in public speaking, and 5) Provide leadership opportunities for young people.

4-H Fashion Show: Contestant can compete in the construction, buying division or natural fiber. Buying division categories include: Business/ Interview Attire, Fantastic Fashions Under \$25, Semi-Formal to Formal and Special Interest. Construction Division categories include: Everyday Living, ReFashion, Semi-Formal to Formal and Theatre/ Costume. Natural fiber categories include: wool/ mohair and cotton. Senior 4-H members who have completed and won at the district Fashion Show competition can compete at the Fashion Show at State Roundup. Each district may send one

contestant from each of the categories in construction, buying and natural fiber. If a participant is a district Fashion Show buying or construction winner and a district Fashion Show Natural Fiber winner they will be able to compete in both contests.

Fashion Storyboard: Contestant has the opportunity to create a storyboard of their original design. 4-H FID Storyboard is an industry-inspired method of displaying of original designs. The storyboard includes original illustrations and flats, as well as, additional materials (such as photos from the internet or magazines, paper, fabric swatches, patterns, etc.) that have influenced the unique design. Participation in the FID Storyboard contest provides members an opportunity to gain knowledge of career responsibilities of a designer and illustrator, enhance creativity and originality and develop visual communication skills.

Project Details:

In this project, youth learn about robotics, computers, alternative energy, engineering, and agri-science. This project allows youth to dream, explore, and experiment in various areas for possibilities in careers and education.

Opportunities Available:

Robotics: Robots are all around us. From the food we eat to the cars we drive, robots help make our lives easier and more efficient. The field of robotics is expanding at a rapid pace, and Texas 4-H is poised to help lead young people into this exciting field.
