Clover Kids is a FUN 4-H program for children in kindergarten through second grade. Children participate in hands-on activities designed to build lots of different skills! The purpose of the 4-H Clover Kids Program is to help youth learn social skills, reinforce formal school programs through informal, non-competitive experiential projects and activities, develop self-esteem and build family strengths.

Young County 4-H hopes to provide as many opportunities to our CLOVER KIDS through the assistance of parent volunteers. Please visit with Extension Office regarding opportunities for K-2. We currently do not have a clover kids leader and therefor not able to provide as many opportunities directly for this particular age group at this time. However, most clubs and some projects allow participation.

It is IMPORTANT to understand that if clover kids are joining a club or project meeting it is imperative that just like a 4-H member they are expected to be able to sit still when needed, listen when others are talking, show respect to everyone participating, etc. If your child is not quite able to participate in a way that does not distract others we ask that you wait to participate until they are able to do so. In no way do we want to take away from the experience of our official 4-H members. We understand that some activities are not always age appropriate for clover kids when they are piggy backing with another meeting. This is where our parent volunteers can come into play should they choose and take on a more leadership role by providing those special opportunities planned just for the younger kids.



DOG PROJECT

November-December: Dog Care & Training

January: Validation

February-May: Dog Show preparation

Project Commitment Time:

Commitment of 10 -15 minutes each day to work with your dog and training meetings once a week.

Supplies Needed:

A DOG (of course), Vaccination records, Martingale collar, 6 foot leash (No Chain Leashes), Dog treats (something your dog really Likes!), 1 inch 3-ring binder to keep your learning info sheets in.

Project Details:

Mixed breed or purebred, all kinds of dogs are welcome in the 4-H Dog Care and Training Project. Youth can have a well-mannered family member in about 6 weeks with basic obedience training class. After obedience training, sights can be set on Canine Good Citizenship Certification or competition at a dog show. Youth may also learn about daily care and health of their dog, and being a "dog foster parent." There are even community service activities youth can do with their dog. Most important of all is having fun as youth build a bond with their dog and make friends who love dogs too! Contests in this project area include the Open Educational Presentation, the Texas 4-H Dog Show, and various Dog Shows throughout the year.

SHOOTING SPORTS

Project Details

This Texas 4-H project covers firearm safety and teaches responsible handling and use for a variety of firearms, Including pistols, rifles, shotguns, muzzle loading, and archery. In the Shooting Sports project, youth will learn: how to load and shoot a variety of firearms, proper maintenance of firearms, parts, and accessories, proper safety procedures in handling and shooting, about shooting sports competitions and how to participate, hunting procedures, laws and ethics related to shooting, hunting, and firearms use, and about careers related to firearms and shooting sports.

Young County 4-H currently offers opportunities for archery, rifle, and shotgun.

Project Season/Practice Schedule

Season is determined on what coaches we have available and when their schedules allow.

<u>Archery</u> is currently being offered year round. Practices are determined based on coaches availability, number of participants participating and safety measures needing to be taken into consideration, etc. Please refer to the Young County 4-H Calendar posted each month. You are also encouraged to reach out to one of our coaches (see volunteer list) or join the Young County 4-H Shooting Sports facebook page for practices, updates, weather conditions, etc.



<u>Rifle & Shotgun</u> have typically been a spring project beginning the Sunday immediately following Super Bowl Sunday. We are very limited on coaches in these two disciplines and practices for the 2020-2021 4-H year. We will not be able to promote or schedule any practices until previous coaches have been confirmed, new coaches secured and attend training, etc. before we can provide any further information on potential practices. Please have any interested individuals contact the Extension Office for more information on how they can help get these disciplines on the calendar again.

Project Volunteers

All adults interested in volunteering or coaching within the shooting sports project are required to enroll as a 4-H volunteer. Volunteer enrollment will confirm individual has completed a background check as well as having participated in a volunteer training.

Volunteers:

Individuals can assist coaches and extension staff with a variety of tasks. Tasks could include check-in, making sure members have completed all requirements in order to shoot, helping with the management of equipment, etc. Volunteers must enroll in 4-H.

Coaches:

In order for any adult to assist another 4-H member with their equipment, shooting, or any other tasks related to actual shooting practice must be a certified Texas 4-H shooting sports coach. Interested individuals must have completed a certified 4-H Shooting Sports Coaches training provided by Texas 4-H. This is a 2 day course held throughout the year all over the state. If you are interested in assisting with the 4-H Shooting Sports program as a coach please contact the Young County Extension Office. Office staff will help provide you with training dates as they come available throughout the year. For others interested in a general volunteer role please sign up at texas.4honline.com.

Project Requirements

- All shooters must be enrolled in 4-H through the 4-Honline registration site.
- All shooters must have completed 4-H & city waivers
- All shooters must have participated in a 4-H Safety Meeting.
- Rules & Additional information located on the Texas 4-H Shooting Sports website & District 3 4-H website.



Best Practices for Conducting 4-H Events During COVID-19





Local Guidelines —

Check with the local County Extension Office prior to any event or activity for restrictions, requirements, mandates, and/or approvals required or set by local health authorities, cities, and/or county government.

Refreshments,

Only pre-packaged foods or meals should be used. Buffets or "potluck" meals must be avoided. Under no circumstance should there be taste testing or food sampling at events. Disposable utensils, napkins, cups, and plates should be used.

Virtual & Distance **Program Options**

Consider meeting outdoors if possible.

Guidelines for Attendance & **Meeting Locations**

Attendance should be taken at all events and lists should be sent to the Extension Office within 10 days of the meeting. These lists must include everyone who was at the meeting (youth members, volunteers, parents, siblings, guests). Participants should provide their own pen/pencil or consider having a person record attendance.

Volunteers and participants should bring their own masks/face coverings; however, it is suggested to have a few on hand for those that fail to do so.

Masks/face coverinas must be worn (over the nose and mouth) when it is not feasible to maintain six feet of social distancing from other individuals not in the same household.

10 Positive Steps to stay negative

- With your CEA, develop a plan that is based on local and state guidelines.
- 2. Secure location that meets current COVID-19 capacity guidelines.
- Determine activities that will take place and how best to modify for participant safety
- Communicate with your volunteers and participants that if they have any symptoms of COVID-19 or feel ill, they must not attend.
- Anyone who appears sick or exhibits symptoms/risk factors of COVID-19 must be sent away immediately.
- Communicate with volunteers and participants to bring their own masks/face coverings; however, it is suggested to have a few on hand for those that fail to do so.
- Arrange seating and activity tables to maximize social distancing. It is recommended that activities be individual with social distancing occurring, face masks worn, and all items disinfected between participant use. If social distancing cannot occur, face masks must be worn, and all items are to be disinfected between participant use.
- Regularly touched surfaces, such as doorknobs, tables, chairs, etc. should be disinfected before and after use.
- For each 4-H meeting or activity, have EVERYONE complete the COVID-19 Screening Form. A hard copy of this document should be kept on file by the volunteer and/or county agent.
- 10. Make hand sanitizer available for attendees as they arrive

PLEDGE#

FOR MY CLUB, MY COMMUNITY, MY COUNTRY, AND MY WORLD.

Best Practices for Adult and 4-H Club Meetings, Programs, Banquets and Events:

- Group meetings may be at a 50% capacity of space or fewer people only if social distancing can be practiced, WITH a limited capacity of 50 people. If the local health authority or county commissioner's court implements a mandate of fewer people, then that policy must be followed. If your meeting could potentially have over 50% capacity or over 50 persons in attendance, submit a preparedness plan to Young County Extension Office for approval. Preparedness plan must be submitted 14 days prior to the event.
- Pre-order supplies and materials, including tissues and hand sanitizer, masks, etc. Encourage participants to bring their own masks/face coverings
- Masks/ Face Coverings MUST be worn by all individuals, per the Governors order (GA-29), unless the county hosting the event is exempt per the Governor's Resolution GA-29 on July 2, 2020.
- Frequently clean high-touch areas, including door handles, surfaces, handrails, etc. within the confinement of the physical space of the program. Check with facilities and venues on requirements for cleaning/sanitizing facilities after and during use.
- Actively monitor where COVID-19 is circulating. Advise participants in advance that if they have any symptoms or feel unwell, they should not attend. Send anyone who appears sick away, whether employee or client.
- The COVID 19 Screening Form can be used for the purpose of screening ALL participants (youth, adults/volunteers, little siblings)
- It is imperative that 4-H Club Managers/Project Leaders/Volunteers stay in contact with their County Extension Agents.

- 6. All projects must be complete prior to barn entry. Every attempt will be made to maintain safety for all during the show.
- 7. Offloading assistance is not guaranteed. Should you need assistance with items please contact superintendent prior to arrival.
- 8. YCJLS will not be responsible for loss or damage to projects.
- 9. Documentation: Exhibitors will complete appropriate registration form so that entries can be labeled properly following judging for public viewing.
- 10. AWARDS: Ribbons will be given, at the judge's discretion for each entry, as follows: Blue, Red, White, Pink, Yellow, and Participation. Grand and Reserve Champion ribbons will also be presented. Please note that the Creative Arts contest is NOT part of the YCJLS Premium Sale.

POUND CAKE CONTEST

RULES & GUIDELINES

- 1. Eligible Entries: Entries are limited to Eligible Young County 4-H and FFA members. Participants may enter up to two pound cakes to be judged.
- 2. Entries are to be checked in between 5:00pm and 7:00pm on Wednesday, January 13, 2021 at the Young County Arena. No late entries will be accepted. Judging will begin promptly at 7:00pm.
- 3. All entries must follow the same recipe.

2021 Pound Cake Recipe to be used:

- 1 ½ cups butter, softened at room temp
- 1 (8oz) package cream cheese, softened
- 3 cups sugar
- 6 large eggs
- 3 cups all-purpose flour
- 1/8 teaspoon salt
- 1 tablespoon vanilla extract

Beat butter and cream cheese at medium speed with an electric mixer until creamy; gradually add sugar, beating well. Add eggs, 1 at a time, beating until combined. Crack eggs into a bowl first before adding to the mixture to make sure you avoid shells in the cake mix. Sift 3 cups of flour. Combine flour and salt; gradually add to butter mixture, beating at low speed just until blended after each addition. Stir in vanilla. Pour batter into a greased and floured 10-inch Bundt pan. Smooth the top of the cake or bottom of the cake with a spatula to even it out. Bake at 300° for 1 hour and 40 minutes or until a wooden pick inserted in center comes out clean. Cool in pan on a wire rack 10 to 15 minutes; remove from pan, let cool completely on wire rack. Resource: Southern Living 2001

- 4. Judging will be based on Taste, Texture, Appearance, and detail to instructions. There will be two classes judged: Senior (Grades 8-12) and Junior (Grades 3-7)
- 5. Awards: Each class will have ribbon winners and a monetary scholarship. A Grand and Reserve Champion will be determined. In the selection of the grand and reserve champion of each division, once the grand champion has been determined from the first place entry of each class, the second place entry from this class will be moved forward to determine the reserve champion.
- Pound Cake Winner's will be notified on Wednesday, January 13, 2021 by phone. Entries may be picked up on Saturday, January 16, 2021 at 2pm. All entries not picked up will be disposed of.
- 7. Grand and Reserve Champion will qualify for the Young County Junior Livestock Premium Sale and will be carried through the sale by the owners. Only the exhibitor, one assistant, and his/her cake will be allowed in the sale ring during the premium auction.
- 8. Champions will be required to bake a fresh pound cake the day of the YCJLS Premium Sale. Sale will take4 place on Saturday, January 16, 2021 in the Young County Arena at 2pm. All funds from the Sale will go straight to the Young County Junior Livestock Show Board to help support the Young County Junior Livestock Show.
